Marlboro High School Nature Center



Touch Ponds and Footbridge were constructed with assistance from the Marlboro SWCD, NRCS and Marlboro County Public Works.

The *Touch Ponds* for the Marlboro High School Nature Center are completed. An underground irrigation system has been installed. Tree selection and planting for the *Arboretum* is complete. A second phase of funding has been approved by the SC Forestry Commission through a grant submitted by the Marlboro SWCD. This Project is now funded by two Urban and Community Forestry Grants from the SC Forestry Commission with contributions from Marlboro County Public Works, Marlboro Soil & Water Conservation District, the High School Science Club and Marlboro County School District.

Pee Dee Land Trust Accepts First Easement

A 13 acre tract of wilderness that lies along Ten Mile Creek in the Kelleytown area of Darlington County will remain protected as a nature preserve and wildlife habitat area thanks to the generosity of a well-known Hartsville family. Jacqueline J. Segars and her daughters Katharine Kelly Segars and Jacquelyn Segars Watford granted a conservation easement to the Pee Dee Land Trust during a brief signing ceremony on August 8. When completed, this facility will include *Pond Plantings*, a *Footbridge* across the stream between the ponds, an *Amphitheater* with seating for fifty or more persons, a *Composter*, *Boardwalks*, a *Pavilion* and *Feature Gardens*. The Arboretum is near completion with the recent planting of four Palmetto trees, the State Tree of South Carolina.

Other tree plantings consist of twenty different varieties of trees native to South Carolina including, sycamores, white oaks, tupelos, live oaks, maples, dogwoods, river birches, willow oaks, redbuds, and southern magnolias.

Craig Park Nature Trail Funding Approved

The Pee Dee RC&D has assisted the town of Chesterfield in developing a grant proposal to the *Urban and Community Forestry Program* of the South Carolina Forestry Commission. This proposal has been approved and the RC&D is now assisting with the project implementation. The Craig Trail project previously received funding from the South Carolina Trails Program for the construction of boardwalks, stairs and a swinging bridge across Thompson Creek. The new funding will be used to provide interpretative signage including tree identification along the trail. Also the new funding will develop a web site and brochure to increase public awareness of the availability and location of this public facility. The Craig Park in Chesterfield was initially developed through the *Works Progress Administration* in the 1930s.

Rural Fire Protection Water Storage Tanks (Dillon) - Tanks being installed and fitted with hydrant heads. Dry Fire Hydrants (Darlington) - Additional hydrants being installed in the Hartsville area. Thompson Creek TMDL Project (Chesterfield) - Collection and analysis of water samples is continuing. Pee Dee Carolina Bay Preservation - Grant Application Submitted to the Turner Foundation. - Pending Pee Dee Geographic Information - Dillon County Farm and Field boundary digitization completed.
